

ATTACK THE SOCK

TOE UP SOCK PATTERN

This is a toe up sock pattern written for magic loop, but it can be adapted easily to use with double pointed needles. This pattern uses two stranded color work and includes sections where the color not in use will be floated along the wrong side. This sock should be knit at a looser gauge than your normal socks to ensure stretch in the sock.

MATERIALS

MC – 80g of black fingering weight yarn

CC – 40g of aqua/green/blue fingering weight yarn

Stitch markers

US 1 – 2.25 mm long circular needles (or equivalent size for your sock gauge)

PATTERN

- Use Judy's Magic Cast on to cast on 16 stitches and knit the set up round.
- Round 1: [k1, kfb, k to last stitch, kfb] on each side of the sock - increased stitch count by 4
- Round 2: k
- Repeat until the total stitches equal 56 (64) [72].
- Begin working the charted Teeth pattern on the front and the Sole pattern on the back until foot reaches 1.5 - 2" less than your actual foot measurement.
- Work in the Fish Lips Kiss Heel in the MC yarn (or substitute any short row heel that you prefer).
- Continue knitting the front of the sock in the established Teeth chart. If you have added in the heel mid-chart, k MC along the back of the sock (carrying the CC) until reaching row 1 or row 12, then continue using the Teeth chart on both sides of the sock.
- Knit in pattern until leg reaches desired length ending on row 12 or row 24 of the Teeth chart.
- Knit 2x2 ribbing in MC for 2" (or desired length) for the cuff.
- Bind off using a stretchy bind off.
